

# Shirebrook Station Loop

A 3.3 mile circular walk from Shirebrook Railway Station on the Robin Hood Line.

This will take you in towards the Town Centre, onwards towards links with Langwith via the Archeological Trail and the larger Bolsover loop. (Accessible via 'NDNN' app)

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The name Shirebrook was first recorded around 1202 as Scirebroc, believed to mean "Boundary/bright brook."


